1. Call to Order / Introductions / Review Agenda

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 1:35 PM.

2. **Review / Approve Minutes**

The Chairman asked if there were any changes or additions to the April, 2016 meeting minutes.

On a motion by Ian Horlacher, seconded by Lora Glover, the Committee approved the minutes as presented.

Action Items:

3. Congestion Mitigation & Air Quality (CMAQ)/Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Project solicitation Process

Andrea Napoli shared that the TAC is being asked to review and approve the project selection and application process to award the MPO's Federal STBG and CMAQ funds for 2019-2021. This will begin the development of the MRMPO's 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

Due to the MRMPO Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Project List having been recently developed and approved, staff proposes to apply the 2019-2021 STBG and CMAQ dollars to projects listed in the Short Range Project List (see Draft 2019-2021 STBG/CMAQ Project List. Any remaining dollars would then be applied to a project selected from the Medium Range Project List. Note that any projects proposed for CMAQ funding will need to confirm eligibility. All projects will need to have an application completed and submitted. **Deadline for application submittal is September 30**.

Dates and instructions have been updated.

The following items were also included in the materials presented to the Committee:

- **Draft 2019-2021 STBG/CMAQ Project List** for review and recommendation developed using the RTP Short Range Project List, excluding project currently in the 2015-2018 TIP, and contains two projects from the Medium Range Project List (as remaining funds allow)
- **RTP Short Range Project List** for reference
- RTP Medium Range Project List for reference
- **STBG & CMAQ Funding Application Packet** for review and approval (Due date is Sept. 30th)

Purpose – including Balance Forward and anticipated funding available. Amounts are uncertain at this point.

The "Balance Forward Funds" were provided in the RTP Project List. CMAQ and STP fund allocations have already been approved for short and some medium range projects.

TIP projects were pulled. Ms. Napoli said that available CMAQ and STBG funds had been applied to each project, but that both Fruitdale projects in Grants Pass could not be funded with the dollars in this allocation. The RTP allocations were not used in the calculations. John Vial said he thought that it was a mistake to assume that the project funding, based on the provided list, would ultimately be funded, when it could change through the application process. Ms. Napoli stated that the list was designed to be an example, rather than an approved list.

All projects must complete an application and go through the approval process. All projects, including Public Transportation, must be in an adopted TSP, regardless of being short, medium or long range. The Committee discussed whether regulations were an ODOT preference, or found in law, how JOCO Transit projects fit into the scenario, and how the County's transit hub fits into the process. ODOT will clarify the need for consistency with the appropriate TSPs. Scott Chancey expressed that the adopted Transit "Plan" should carry the same weight as an adopted TSP. The RTP would need to be amended to include the JOCO Transit Plan.

The transit hub project needs to be researched a bit more. TSPs must be consistent with RTPs.

On a motion by John Vial, seconded by Ian Horlacher, the Committee concurred with the project selection process for awarding 2019-2021 Federal funds, and forward it to the Policy Committee for approval. The vote was approved by unanimous voice vote.

4. MRMPO Planning Update –

- Salem and Central Lane MPO are now eligible for CMAQ funding. RVCOG has recommended to ODOT that currently approved projects proceed, but the resolution of this is unclear. So far, meetings have been scheduled to address this issue. The reductions, in some cases, may be quite significant. John Vial pointed out that ODOT is under no obligation to award funds. Upcoming meetings will be held at technical and policy levels.
- The GHG Target Rule Committee met last week and discussed whether the MRMPO should be included in the program. Mr. Moore informed the GHG Committee that the MRMPO Policy Committee voted not to participate, which "shocked" the Target Rule Advisory Committee. Another meeting on this issue will be held in July.
- Next month a discussion on how projects get into the RTP will be brought to the TAC.
- The new fiscal year begins in July, and part of new items will include an Emergency Alternative Escape Plan and developing the VMT reduction project.



Information on the new project is enumerated, below:

A. Amendment to RTP: Transit Hub – Josephine County

Description: The project consists of developing a transit hub on two parcels of land that the County already owns. The hub will consist of on street parking for six separate transit vehicles, passenger shelters for all six slots, bike racks, parking for park and ride use, additional seating besides the shelters, lighting, security and a customer service building.
