Background	The FY 2022-23 UPWP was adopted with the knowledge that the actual number would change due to a delay on the part of FTA. That modification was sent July and MPO staff made an administrative amendment. Subsequently, ODC sent out a new set of numbers on September 15 th . These new numbers reduce our PL allocation by \$104,000. This is the amount of PL funds which the MF set aside two years ago to help pay for the Oregon Household Activity Surve Although ODOT staff had been notified of this set aside back in 2020, action was not taken. This set aside was apparently included in the total numbers the MPO staff received initially – unbeknownst to MPO staff.

A. Add Project to TIP: I-5: from Creswell to the California Border (KN22737)

Description: Establish National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) fast charging stations at 50-mile intervals along I-5 between Creswell and the California border, to provide electric vehicle drivers with reliable, fast charging along major corridors in Oregon.
