Dear Members of the Oregon Legislature,

On behalf of the Middle Rogue Metropolitan Planning Organization (MRMPO) Policy Committee, we write to emphasize the critical need for sustained and increased transportation funding to address pressing challenges in our region. As a federally designated Metropolitan Planning Organization, we oversee regional transportation planning for the cities of Grants Pass, Rogue River, Gold Hill, and unincorporated areas in Josephine and Jackson counties. Our region's growing population and aging infrastructure require immediate investment in three key areas.

#### **City and County Road Maintenance**

Local roads across our region face deteriorating conditions due to deferred maintenance and insufficient state-shared revenue. Potholes, crumbling shoulders, and outdated drainage systems jeopardize safety and increase long-term repair costs. Dedicated funding for the preservation and maintenance of our regional transportation system is greatly needed.

#### **Transit System**

Josephine Community Transit (JCT) provides essential services to our communities, including seniors, low-income residents, students, and workers. However, any reductions in state funding will make it difficult to maintain service frequency, modernize fleets, or meet rising demand. Enhanced transit is vital to our economy and environment.

#### Safety and Multimodal Priorities

Safe roadways including pedestrian and bicycle networks are central to our Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). Funding for safety, bicycle and pedestrian projects is urgently needed.

In conclusion, the MRMPO stands ready to collaborate on solutions. We urge swift action by the Legislature to pass the Transportation Investment Package (TRIP) to ensure that Oregon's transportation system remains safe and economically viable.
